RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Every article in competition must correspond in number and description with the premium list, and be in its proper class in order to obtain premiums. No change or alteration will be permitted after judging begins.
2. Any person attempting to interfere with the awarding ceremony during the adjudication shall forfeit the premium he or she might otherwise be entitled to in the division.
3. The judge may award no premium, second or first premium as merit may warrant.
4. All protests and appeals from the judges' decision must be made in writing to the secretary, before the close of the fair.
5. All articles must be entered in the name of the maker. No

- premiums allowed on articles purchased or borrowed.
6. Police and fire regulations will be provided, but the management will not be responsible for any loss that may occur.
 7. All articles must remain in place until 6:00 PM on the closing day of the fair under penalty of forfeiting premium, except with permission of the Fair Board.
 8. There is no cost to the exhibitor to enter items into Open Class. Only one entry per lot is permitted.
 9. The exhibitor must be a resident of Big Stone County or adjoining counties.
 10. Exhibition is open to amateurs. You are considered a professional if you earn \$5,000 or more annually in the specific area being exhibited. Agronomy is an exception. For example, if you earn more than \$5,000 annually selling jams, we ask that you not bring jams.

All entries must be made on either Wednesday, Aug. 4 from 5:30 PM-7:30 PM or Thursday, Aug. 5 from 7 AM-1 PM.

Exhibits must remain displayed until 6:00 PM, Sunday, Aug. 8.

Exhibitors are asked to bring a list of their exhibits along to the registration desk on entry day to speed up the entry process or pre-register.

Pre-registration is encouraged, but you do not have to pre-register to enter items.

PRE-REGISTERING
When you arrive at the Open Class building on Entry Day, we will have your lot tags and entry sheet ready. Changes may still be made to your entry

list once you arrive at the building so do not be concerned if you are not able to bring an item you had pre-registered. We are also able to accommodate additions.

You may pre-register on-line or via email until 9:00 PM on Tuesday, Aug. 3, 2010 if you plan to enter exhibits Wednesday evening and until 9:00 PM on Wednesday, Aug. 4, 2010 if you plan to enter on Thursday.

F-CLASS 2 – VEGETABLES

PREPARING EXHIBITS:

BEANS: Harvest before constrictions appear between seeds, when seeds are about half grown. Ends of pods should not be broken off in picking. Pods should be uniform. Pods may be wiped clean, but not washed. Trim stems to a uniform a quarter to a half inch in length.

BEETS, CARROTS, PARSNIPS, RUTABAGAS, TURNIPS: Root crops should be mature but not over grown, pithy or coarse in texture. Tops trimmed off one-half inch above crown. Side roots trimmed off but not the taproot. Roots carefully washed but not scrubbed.

BROCCOLI: Heads should be dark or purplish green and compact. Avoid yellow flowers in head. Stems cut about 5 inches from top of head.

BRUSSEL SPROUTS: Firm, bright green sprouts, all uniform size and shape.

CABBAGE: Stems cut about a quarter inch below head. Remove blemished or broken leaves, but care should be taken not to peel the heads too much. A few outer wrapper leaves are desirable. Specimens may be washed.

CAULIFLOWER: Heads should be white, compact and free of small leaves. Stems cut so as to leave 4 to 6 leaves. Outer leaves trimmed to 1-2 inches above the

white head. Use soft bristled brush to remove dirt from heads.

CELERY: Remove roots of stalk and trim butt to form a triangle or pyramid. Trim diseased and broken leaves on outside until color is uniform.

SWEET CORN: Select ears that are well filled out to the tip. Kernels should be milky and juicy. Remove outer husks but allow a short shank and the inner husks to remain.

CUCUMBERS, PICKLING: Select fruits 2-4 inches long. Specimens should be the same stage of maturity and uniform in size, shape, and color.

CUCUMBERS, SLICERS: Select fruits that are straight, dark green and 5-10 inches long. They should be uniform in size, shape and color.

KOHLRABI: Ball should be 2-3" in diameter. Roots removed just below the ball. Remove all but the upper 4-6 leaves and trim them to 2-3" in length. Select specimens that are uniform, medium size and not hard or woody. Skin should be easily punctured by thumbnail. They should be cleaned, but not washed.

GARLIC, ONIONS: Have specimens mature and thoroughly cured. The neck should be small. Do not peel to give slick appearance. Only such outer scales that are broken or discolored should be removed. Small basal roots should be left intact but trimmed to a uniform length of a half inch. Wipe or brush but do not wash.

PEAS: Harvest when bright green in color with pods that snap and do not bend with crisp flesh. Ends of pods should not be broken off in picking. Pods may be wiped clean, but not washed. Trim stems to a uniform a quarter to a half inch in length.

EGGPLANT: A mature eggplant should have glossy skin that is barely resistant to touch.

PEPPERS: Select firm shiny peppers with no signs of dehydration. Trim the stem to a half inch. They should be uniform in shape and size.

RHUBARB: Select specimens that are straight, uniform and unblemished.

Stalks should be pulled from the plant, not cut. Trim the leaf blade to about one inch above the stalk. SQUASH, SUMMER: Select small to medium size fruits when the rind is soft and easily punctured with thumbnail. Leave about a half inch of stem and wipe fruits clean.

SQUASH, WINTER, PUMPKINS:

Select mature specimens where the rind resists pressure of the thumbnail. Fruits should be free of defects. Leave stem attached to the fruit.

SWISS CHARD: Select plants that are fresh, crisp and have bright green leaves. Trim off roots and trim butts to pyramid shape. Trim off diseased and broken leaves on the outside until the color is uniform.

TOMATOES: Select fruit that are uniform in size, shape and color. Fruits should be perfectly shaped and free of cracks or blemishes. Trim stems to a half inch.

FOOD PRESERVATION

1. The rules for the food preservation must be met for the entry to be accepted. All canning must be done in standard, colorless canning jars of any size. Regulation lids must be used for all products. Jelly products must be in regulation jars and must be sealed with a lid. No wax should be used for jelly or jam.
2. All canning jars must be labeled with the processing time and method and date of processing.
3. The judge reserves the right to open jars of pickles, jam and jelly products when questionable.
